PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

1. I HAVE PROBABLE CAUSE TO BELIEVE THAT: NAME OF DEFENDANT: William H. Inlow, DOB: [REDACTED], SSN: [REDACTED], ADDRESS 1: 17880 Bay View Ln. Rocky Mount, MO. 65072, ADDRESS 2:

HAS COMMITTED ONE OR MORE CRIMINAL OFFENSES.

2. THE FACTS SUPPORTING THIS BELIEF ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1.) On February 1, 2020 I responded to an address on Oak street in reference to a terroristic threat that was made to the First Christian Church in Eldon. Upon arrival I met with Pastor Foglesong, Pastor Foglesong advised me that he received a phone call from a Pastor friend that received Emails from William "Dub" Inlow that the First Christian Church in Eldon would "pay for firing a Timothy". Pastor Foglesong explained that a Timothy was a biblical term. The Pastor friend received another email from Inlow stating, "They asked for this. Pray for them tomorrow." Pastor Foglesong said they were going to do a controlled quarantine within the church and only let people they knew come into the church.

2.) Pastor Foglesong printed out the emails for me to have. Pastor Foglesong said he did not take this that serious until the Pastor friend

called back stating the Church should take this more serious because the pastor Friend use to work at a church that Inlow attended and they had problems with Inlow bringing guns into the church and scaring people. The pastor friend said, he and Inlow got into an argument regarding the guns and Inlow got mad and left the Church. The pastor friend also advised Pastor Foglesong that Inlow always has guns on him and multiple guns in his residence.

3.) Chief Kidwell Spoke to Pastor Foglesong earlier and knew what was going on. Chief Kidwell advised me to send a Morgan County deputy to his address to tell him to stop with the emails, he was trespassed from the church, and if he showed up at the church tomorrow he would be arrested on the spot. Contact was made with Morgan County and Deputy Allen agreed to go talk to Inlow. Shortly after Deputy Allen made contact with Inlow, Inlow called the Eldon Police Department requesting to speak with me.

4.) I talked to Inlow on the Phone in Dispatch center and Inlow Raised his voice to tell me I was threatening him by sending a deputy to his house in the middle of the night. I advised Inlow that I was not threatening him; I just needed him to know he was not allowed to come to the church. Inlow then stated they (the church) asked him to come back to the church. I told Inlow that was false that I spoke with several church board members and they did not want him to come to the church. I told Inlow I would like him to come to the Eldon Police Department Monday morning to speak with an officer regarding the emails. Inlow raised his voice again and said he would be there first thing Monday morning with his lawyer.

5.) Shortly after I got off the phone with Inlow Jefferson City Police department called and officer with badge #46 wanted to speak to me. The officer wanted to talk about a case that we were investigating. The officer stated it involved William Inlow. I told the officer about the threats the church received. The officer then explained that a sister church in Jefferson City received the same emails. The officer wanted to know if we were investigating it and I told him were.

6.) While on the Phone with Jefferson City Police Department I received a call from the Lake Ozark Police Department requesting to speak with me. I spoke with Officer Khachi and Detective Green, they advised me that Inlow's family members sent the Lake Ozark Police department screenshots of the emails regarding the threats to the church and the family members

were tagged in the threats to the churches. The family members said they perceived it as a farewell note.

7.) After receiving both of these phone calls I called Chief Kidwell and told him about the calls from Jefferson City and Lake of the Ozarks. Chief Kidwell advised me to have Morgan County go back out to Inlow's residence and arrest him for charges of terroristic threats and harassment. Morgan County then went and arrested Inlow and met me in Barnett so I could transport him to Miller County Jail.

8.) Upon Meeting the Deputies they advised me he has been compliant for the most part, but he does get angry and start to yell. Inlow was then placed n properly adjusted and double locked handcuffs and placed in the back of the patrol car.

9.) While in route to Miller County Inlow made a spontaneous utterance that he sent the emails and would gladly talk to anyone about the emails. I did not respond to Inlow and he made another spontaneous utterance that no one would understand where he was coming from. Inlow was placed on a 24 hour hold in the Miller County Jail. This incident occurred in the City of Eldon, in the County of Miller and in the State of Missouri.
