PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

I, ALAN R MITCHELL II

knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law,
state that the facts contained herein are true.

1. I have probable cause to believe that on 02/12/2019, at
2417 QUAIL DR - B, COLUMBIA, MO 65202,
FRANK SPEEDY SPENCER [REDACTED]
committed one or more criminal offense(s):
194.425-001Y20175599 ABANDONMENT OF A CORPSE

2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:
On the evening of 11/29/2018 through the morning of 11/30/2018 the suspect,
Frank Spencer, abandoned the corpse of N.B. in a small field directly behind his
residence at 2421 Quail Drive Apartment A and then left the state on the
afternoon of 11/30/2018. In the following weeks Spencer lead others who knew
N.B. to believe that she had traveled with him to Atlanta Georgia and was alive
and with him there.

N.B. was reported missing on 02/12/2019 by relatives. N.B. was last seen on
11/29/2018 by subjects, E.N. and K.N. On 02/19/2019 N.B.'s body was located
directly behind 2421 Quail Drive. The body was partially decomposed and had been
out in the elements for an extended period of time.

M.S. stated he saw Spencer on the evening of 11/29/2018. M.S. stated he was
giving Spencer a ride to a bible study and that N.B. was not with him. M.S.
stated Spencer got out of his vehicle in the area of Business Loop 70 and
Providence Road. M.S. stated Spencer told him that he needed to go back home and
check on N.B. and was acting paranoic and odd. M.S. stated he was not going to
drive Spencer back home as they were already late for bible study so Spencer
chose to leave the vehicle and call someone else for a ride.

E.N. stated he last saw N.B. on 11/29/2018 at her residence, 2421 Quail Drive
Apartment A. E.N. stated he got a call from Spencer on the evening of 11/29/2018
asking for a ride from the Business Loop 70/Providence Road area to his home.
E.N. stated he picked up Spencer and drove him to 2421 Quail Drive Apartment A.
E.N. stated Spencer was N.B.'s husband.

E.N. resides in the apartment B of the same duplex. E.N. stated in the early
morning of 11/30/2018 between 0200 and 0400 hours he heard the garage door on

the back of the residence open up and then close a short time later. E.N. stated it was not normal for the garage doors to be used and not normal for them to be used at that time of night. E.N. stated on 11/30/2019 in the later morning Spencer asked him to take him to the bus stop so he could catch a bus going to Atlanta Georgia. E.N. stated he did not see N.B. and Spencer told him N.B. would be meeting him at the bus stop. E.N. stated Spencer made the comment when they reached the bus stop "whatever happened, I didn't do it". E.N. stated Spencer never returned to the residence after being dropped off at the bus stop. E.N. stated the move to Atlanta Georgia was unexpected and that Spencer left behind most of his property and never returned to get it. E.N. stated he received a couple of calls from Spencer over the following weeks and in one of those conversations Spencer stated that N.B. was in Georgia with him but could not come to the phone. --

K.N. stated she last saw N.B. on 11/29/2018 in her duplex at 2421 Quail Drive Apartment A. K.N. stated she saw Spencer on 11/30/2018 when he was asking E.N. for a ride to the bus stop to go to Georgia. K.N. stated she asked Spencer where N.B. was and he told her the N.B. left him a few days earlier and had not come back. K.N. stated she knew this was a lie because she had seen N.B. on the residence on the previous evening. K.N. also reported being a part of the conversation where Spencer told her that N.B. was in Atlanta Georgia with him and could not come to the phone.

Police have not located any subjects that saw or talked to N.B. since 11/29/2019.

Spencer's location is unknown at this time and he has made no attempts to contact with law enforcement regarding N.B., his wife, being missing or dead. [02/18/2020 08:01, CPAMITCH, 291, CPD]
