Salisbury R-IV School District 2020-2021 Back-to-School Plan



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Entering the School Building

Phase II (Minimal/Moderate Spread)

- Post signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread, COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocol.
- Implement protocol for students/staff who feel ill/experience symptoms when they come to school.
- All students will report immediately to classrooms upon arrival at school. No student congregation in hallways, commons area, gym or Multi-Purpose Room. unless eating breakfast.
- Screen students and staff (to the extent feasible):

 Take temperatures of symptomatic staff and students. Isolate and send home if internal temperature is over 100.0°F.
- Restrict nonessential visitors and volunteers and require use of face coverings/masks.

Phase III (Substantial Spread)

 School building is closed; administration will leverage virtual tools and platforms wherever possible to conduct essential business and keep in-person reporting to minimum during school closures. (For example teachers may conduct instruction from home or school and non-certified staff will be utilized to assist with necessary tasks during school hours.)

When a Child, Staff Member, or Visitor Becomes Sick at School
 Provide an isolation room to separate anyone who exhibits COVID-like symptoms. Communicate closely with local health officials regarding any potential COVID-19 cases. Advise sick staff members and children not to return until they are no longer symptomatic. Those individuals who have had close contact to a person diagnosed with COVID-19 should stay home and follow state health department guidance if symptoms develop. If a person does not have symptoms, follow appropriate state health department guidance for home quarantine.
