MOTION TO SET BOND

COMES NOW, the State of Missouri, by and through, Nicholas Komoroski, Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Boone, and respectfully requests that this Court set bond in this matter and in support of said motion submits the following:

1. The State is charging Defendant with murder in the 1st degree.
2. At the time of the currently alleged offense, Defendant was on parole for felony assault in the third degree against a special victim and assault in the second degree with 7-year sentences.
3. Defendant is known to have the following prior findings of guilt and/or convictions: assault 3d special victim (2019), assault 2d (2018), stealing (2017), misdemeanor stealing in the 4th degree (Iowa 2015), 2 counts municipal stealing (2015), municipal resisting (2012), stealing & property damage 2d (2011), and trespass 1st (2008).
4. Defendant poses a danger to the victim and/or the community because he is alleged to have killed a person in a violent manner and because he has a history of violent offenses.
5. Defendant is believed to be a flight risk because of the nature of the offense and Defendant's criminal history.
6. For the reasons stated above, the State would request that a warrant be issued and bond be set at \$1 million cash only. The State would further request that the following bond conditions be added:
 - a. The defendant will appear in the court in which the case is prosecuted or appealed, from time to time as required to answer the criminal charge.

- b. The defendant will submit to the orders, judgment and sentence, and process of the court having jurisdiction over the defendant.
- c. The defendant shall not commit any new offenses and shall not tamper with any victim or witness in the case, nor have any person do so on the defendant's behalf.
- d. The defendant will comply fully with any and all conditions imposed by the Court in granting release.

WHEREFORE, the State respectfully requests that this Court set bond in the amount and with the conditions requested above.

2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 10/04/2022 at approximately 1917 hours I was called into work to investigate an assault that occurred on the northbound lane overpass of North Highway 63 near where it crosses over Clark Lane. This location is in Columbia and is inside of Boone County.

I was advised by Sergeant Patrick Corcoran that a male, later identified as Jessie Williams, had pushed a female off of the overpass and that the victim sustained injuries that may cause her to die.

I arrived at the police department I read the dispatch notes entered by Boone County Joint Communications. The dispatch notes stated "saw a man throw a woman over the edge of 63 overpass." Dispatch notes also stated the male suspect was "running south on in northbound In". The suspect was described as a biracial male, no shirt, and pants. Dispatch later advised additional suspect information which stated "Lt skin tattoos on chest poss wearing sunglasses/glasses."

The victim was located on the ground underneath the Highway 63 overpass just north of Clark Lane. The victim was identified as KS. KS was transported by ambulance to the University of Missouri Hospital Emergency Room. KS sustained severe injuries to her spine and had internal bleeding. It was later determined

by measuring the distance from the top of the overpass to the ground where KS was located was approximately 38 feet.

Officers located Williams in front of Sams Club off of Conley Road Approximately 20 minutes after the time the call came out through dispatch. While Officer Levi Anderson and Officer Jacob Waldrup were attempting to detain Williams he began to resist by tensing his arm up and pulling them away from the officers. Officers were able to handcuff Williams where he was then transported to do a show to a witness. When Williams was arrested he had on grey pants, no shirt, and had multiple tattoos across his chest.

The witness, NJ, doing the show up stated he observed Williams and KS less than 30 minutes before he heard police vehicle responding to the area. NJ stated KS and Williams were in the homeless camp near where this incident occurred and stated KS was attempting to get some of the belongings back from Williams. NJ positively identified Williams as the male KS was walking with during the show up.

Another witness TK stated she observed KS walking on the overpass less than fifteen minutes before she heard police vehicles. TK stated she observed KS walking with a male who was white or Hispanic who had tattoos across his upper chest.

Officer George Chiang spoke to two witness who observed this incident. The first witness he spoke to was JD. JD told Officer Chiang stated he was traveling north on Highway 63 and was passing the Interstate 70/Clark Lane area. JD told Officer Chiang he observed a male and female struggling on the bridge overpass. JD described the male to Officer Chiang as biracial either middle eastern or hispanic, with shorter dark hair, pants and no shirt. JD told Officer Chiang the male was trying to throw a female over the guard rail. JD told Officer Chiang the male was trying to pick the females legs up while doing so. JD told Officer Chiang the male and the female were then both on top of the guard rail. JD told Officer Chiang the male was then trying to throw the female over the guard rail. JD told Officer Chiang the male was "100% no doubt trying to kill her."

The second witness Officer Chiang spoke to was MF. MF told Officer Chiang she was heading north on Highway 63 and had just went over the Interstate 70/Clark lane area. MF told Officer Chiang she observed a male and a female walking south on the Highway 63 bridge. MF told Officer Chiang the female was walking closer to the guard rail when suddenly after only a couple steps of walking the male grabbed the female and attempted to push her over the guard rail. MF told Officer Chiang the male either had one hand hold her arm or under her shoulder area and had his other hand under the females legs trying to push her over. MF told Officer Chiang the female was fighting back and squirming trying to get out of his grip. MF told Officer Chiang she did not see if the male was actually

able to get the female over the guard rail.

Williams was transported to the Columbia Missouri Police Department. While Williams was in booking Officer Levi Anderson was attempting to get Williams to go into a holding cell. Williams told Officer Anderson he was not going to do anything for him. When Officer Anderson attempted to grab Williams and place him into a holding cell Williams became combative and pushed Officer Anderson. Officer Anderson and I had to throw Williams to the ground and place him back into handcuffs to get him into a holding cell. While Williams was on the ground Officer Anderson told me Williams was the person threw the female over the bridge. After Officer Anderson told me this Williams yelled "No. Self-defense."

Detective Mueller and I later went down to speak to Williams about this incident. Detective Mueller read Williams his Miranda Warning from a department issued Miranda card. During the interview Detective Mueller asked Williams why he thought he was here. Williams responded by saying "death, death." Detective Mueller asked Williams what he meant by that. Williams responded by saying "I'm sick."

I told Williams I was trying to figure out why he pushed KS over the guard rail. I told Williams I did not think he pushed KS off the overpass for no reason and that I thought he pushed KS off for a reason. Williams responded by saying "right." I asked Williams what the reason for why he did it. Williams stated he was having "emotional problems." Detective Mueller asked Williams what he and KS were arguing about. Williams stated "for nothing." I asked Williams what he meant by that and asked if he meant they were arguing about things that aren't important or little things. Williams responded by stating "there's reasons". Williams did not provide any further relevant information about this incident during out interview with him.

The University of Missouri Hospital later provided information that KS had died from her injuries related to this incident.

I believe probable cause exists to arrest Williams for the following:

- In violation of RSMo 565.020 Murder 1st Degree
- In violation of RSMo 575.150 Resisting with an Arrest for a Felony.
- In violation of RSMo 565.056 Assault 4th Degree Special Victim

3. For the issuance of a warrant in a misdemeanor case, complete the following

- (a) I believe that the defendant will not appear in court in response to a criminal summons because:

Williams has multiple arrests for resisting an arrest. Williams is also homeless and has no permanent address in Columbia. Williams has been arrested in multiple states for criminal offenses. After committing this offense

Williams fled the scene on foot and resisted arrest when officers were attempting to place him into handcuffs.

(b) I believe that the defendant poses

(1) a danger to a crime victim because


Williams attempted to kill KS by pushing her over the guardrail of an overpass that sat approximately 38 feet off the ground. Williams caused KS to suffer serious physical injury that may cause her to die.

(2) a danger to the community or to any other person because Williams has convictions for the following:

- Misdemeanor resisiting on 05/05/2009
- Misdemeanor Stealing on 07/07/2011
- Misdemeanor property damage on 07/07/2011
- Misdemeanor resisting on 05/16/2012
- Misdemeanor stealing 01/21/2015
- Misdemeanor stealing on 04/24/2017
- Assault second degree on 12/02/2019

Williams was recently released from prison and is currently on parole for an assault which occurred. The offense for which Williams is on parole for also occurred in Boone County Missouri. During this incident Williams entered a homeless person's tent while he was sleeping. Williams shot the victim with a paintball gun and stabbed him with a knife before fleeing the scene.
