Temporary Restraining Order and Order to Show Cause

It being found that certain cash withdrawals and purchases have been made on accounts of the Petitioner that Respondent has access to but not Petitioner, that there is a lack of oversight by Petitioner over Respondent on said accounts/expenditures, and that irreparable harm can immediately occur should the withdrawals and expenditures by Respondent be improper. It also is found that prior notice of hearing would defeat the purpose of the Petitioner. Additionally, it is found that the funds in question are owned by the Petitioner and therefore no bond be required.


It is hereby found, adjudged, and decreed:

Respondent(s) Randolph County Sheriff's Office and Aaron Wilson are hereby ORDERED and PROHIBITED from transferring, encumbering, concealing, or in anyway disposing of any property, assets or funds held in all bank accounts holding funds or receipts of county monies, inmate funds, accounts receivable, petty cash, and operating funds, including those at Central Bank, and Respondent(s) are ORDERED to notify Petitioner of any proposed expenditures necessary and obtain written approval in the usual course of business and to account to the Court for all expenditures made.

Further, Respondent(s) are ORDERED to appear and show cause why a Preliminary Injunction Should not issue before me in Division I on November 4, 2024 at 9:00 a.m.

This ORDER IS entered this 25th day of October, 2024 at 5:15 pm and to be served by the County Coroner or his designee forthwith.
