NARRATIVE

Remarks

Initial dispatched alarm assignment to a house explosion (side A photo) with people trapped and screaming. On arrival S2 encountered debris in the roadway and heavy fire from a portion of the exploded house. S2C was directed to deploy a 2 1/2" fire hose to the alpha bravo corner (side AB photo) for immediate fire attack to aid in rescue. No victims were noted on the Alpha side during my sizeup, a large natural gas leak was noted on the Alpha Bravo corner and I was unable to determine its exact location. It appeared to be a possible service line to the residence. S2A circled around the structure and found victims self-rescuing from the basement (Victim initial location photo) Charlie side, closer to the Delta wall away from the fire. To my best recollection, at the aforementioned location, two males were self-rescuing and exited the structure while one female was assisted by JCPD and S2A. Another female was already standing outside when S2A came around to the Charlie side, and it is assumed at this time she had already exited the structure as well. E4 had arrived, E4B located a hydrant, while E4C deployed a line to assist in fire control. E4A came to the Charlie side to assist with victim rescue.

S2B established a water supply while S2C and S2A were performing their assigned tasks. S2A was informed there was one person still trapped inside by the Charlie side victims, and began searching. While attempting to find an area that was suitable to enter the structure, the remainder of the alarm assignment had arrived, and Chief 5 had assumed command. S2A requested additional resources to the Charlie side for rescue. E1 began fire attack on the Alpha Bravo corner, S2A was joined by E4A and both attempted to ascertain the victim's location. The remainder of E4's crew was assigned to fire attack as was E1 on their arrival. S2C relayed difficulty in extinguishing the fire as it seemed to be fueled, or gas fed. A majority of the flames had been extinguished by S2C, but the fire continued to burn into vehicles and a trailer located on the Alpha side.

S2A and E4A continued to search around the structure to determine what part of the building the other victim was in. He could be heard but not seen. Two dogs were located inside the structure, and could be seen through the rubble on the Alpha side as well as the Charlie side. The victim stated he was underneath the dogs. S2A made entry to the Bravo Charlie bedroom (BC Corner bedroom) and located a stairwell that had been collapsed. The dogs were much easier to locate, and the victim stated he could see my light much brighter from that area. E3A made verbal contact with the victim and learned he was burned and very hypothermic. He was able to talk and stated he had no other injuries other than burns, and he was not pinned by debris. Chief 5 halted interior operations due to potential collapse and called for SORT and rescue 3 for potential shoring equipment and ongoing rescue efforts. The remainder of the alarm assignment were tasked with various aspects of fire attack, water supply, and a rescue group was created on the arrival of station 3 personnel by Chief 1.

Once the rescue group was formed, rescue operations began in a focused search of an area identified by S2A, E4A, and E3A. All three concurred where they felt the victim would be located. He was found some feet towards the alpha side of that location (BC Corner bedroom 2). He was provided a warming kit from CCEMS. The man was loaded into a SKED stretcher and extricated out of the structure after a minor amount of cutting and tunneling of debris was performed. (rescue photo) The man was then transferred to CCEMS.

Due to the complexity of the incident Chief 5 contacted the MO State Fire Marshal to assist in the investigation. S2A met with the investigators prior to leaving the scene and briefed them on what was found during the first in moments. They stated they needed no further information from S2A. It was the general initial consensus that the building had exploded due to some form of a gas explosion. The details are still under investigation.

Note that estimated structure loss was pulled from Zillow estimate, and the estimate of \$50,000 in belongings loss is a gross estimate due to damage and collapse.

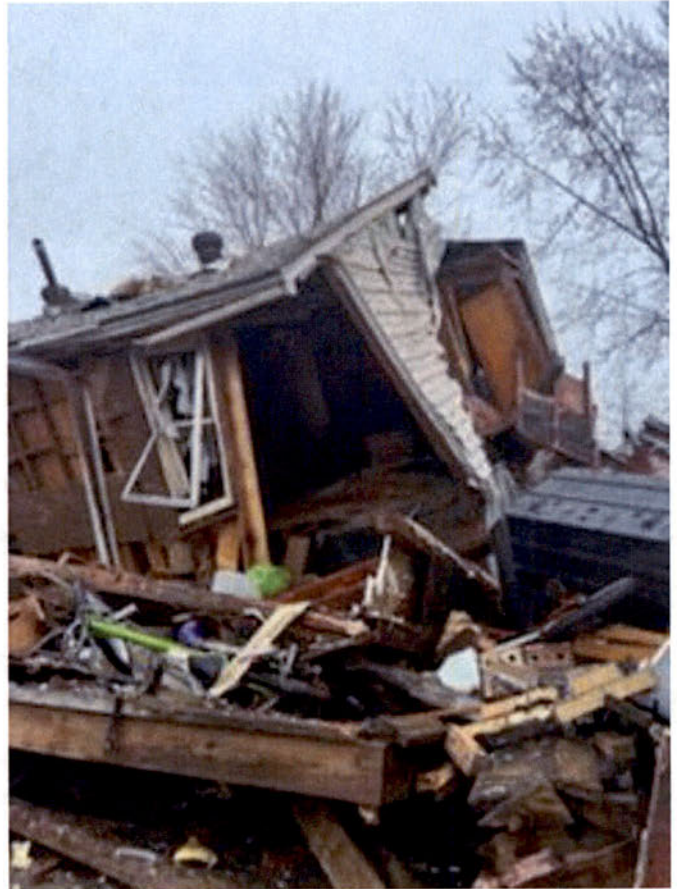

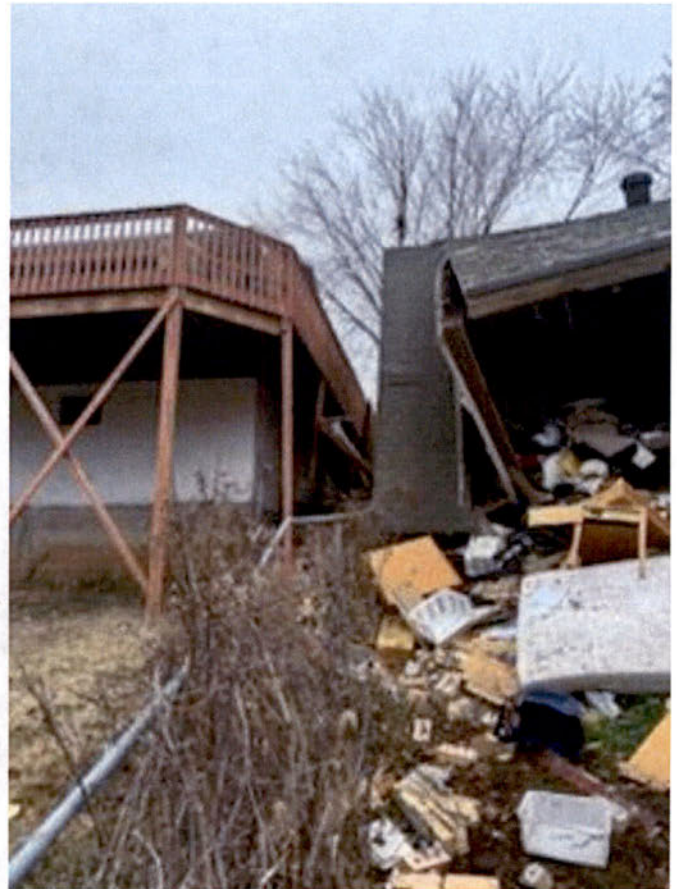

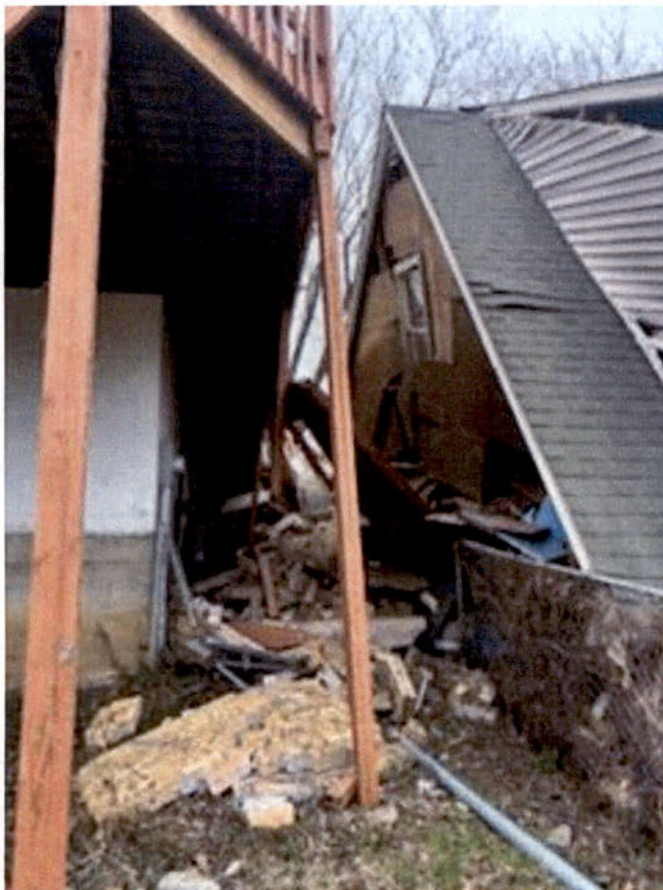

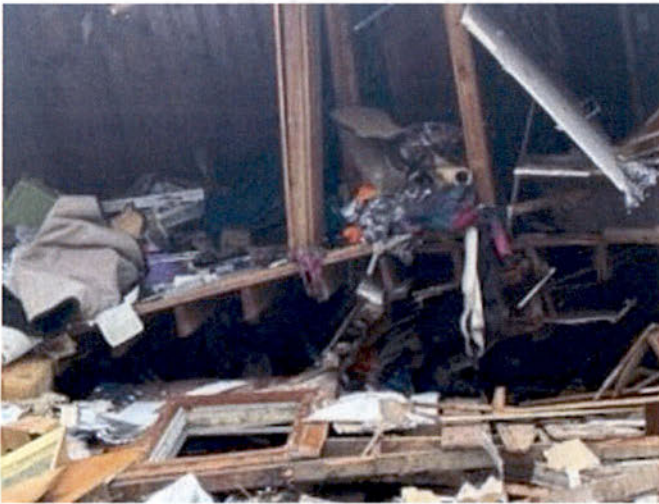

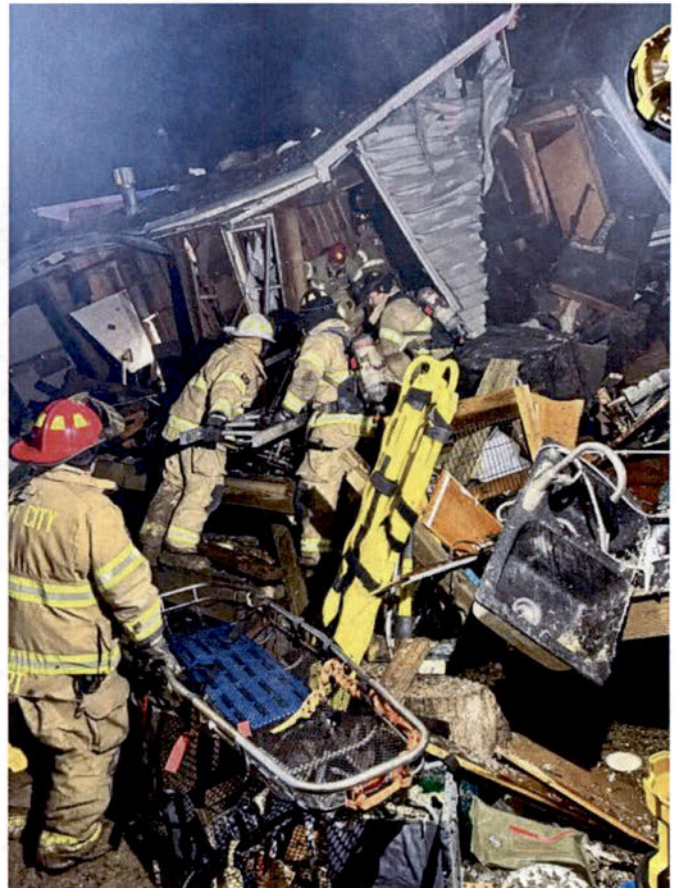

On 11/30/2024 I responded to 2431 St. Louis Road in reference to multiple calls of a house explosion. Upon my arrival I observed the residence collapsed and fully engulfed in flames.

A male subject identified as Tyler Askam was in the street in front of the home. Askam confirmed he was at the residence and stated he believed approximately five additional people were inside. Responding officers on scene heard subjects yelling from behind the residence. Aubrey Hale was identified and assisted from the back yard to be seen by EMS.

I next observed a female subject identified as Vernelia Childs in the backyard and was notified an additional female was trapped inside. I made contact with Michael Bardwell and Leroy Childs who were assisting the female, later identified as Charmaine McKenzie, from beneath the debris. McKenzie was safely removed from the debris and all parties were escorted away from the residence. An additional male was heard screaming from the top level of the residence and was later identified as Wade York.

I spoke with McKenzie who confirmed a total of seven people were inside the home at the time of the explosion. York was the only subject trapped inside while all others were being treated by Cole County EMS for their wounds.

The Jefferson City Fire Department assumed the primary role of working and investigating the scene. York was successfully extracted from the home safely and was treated by medical personnel.

Michael Bardwell, Aubrey Hale, and Wade York were transported to Columbia Missouri hospitals to be treated for their wounds. Leroy and Vernelia Childs were transported to Capital Region in Jefferson City. Charmaine McKenzie was seen by EMS on scene and was released. Tyler Askam left the scene before being seen by EMS.

On 11/30/2024 around 0500 hours, I was contacted in an on-call capacity to respond to the 2400 block of St. Louis Road regarding a residential explosion with several injured victims – and it was unknown if casualties would result.

While enroute, I learned that the Jefferson City Fire Department, Cole County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and the Missouri State Fire Marshall's were already on scene.

Around 0534 hours, I arrived on scene and contacted Officer Bennett – the originating officer. Officer Bennett provided me with brief details of his response and assisted me in identifying the parties involved in the incident.

Officer Bennett first informed me that he contacted Tyler Askam, adding that Askam had left the scene on foot after being first contacted. Therefore, Askam was no longer at the scene. I later verified that Askam had an active felony no-bond warrant out of Gasconade County, MO.

Officer Bennett also assisted in identifying other persons involved, including Michael Bardwell, Aubrey Hale, Wade York, Charmaine McKinzie, Vernelia Childs and Leroy Childs. All of the persons were injured and some labeled as critical by emergency personnel.

With the assistance of JCFD and Cole County EMS personnel, I learned the following:

Michael Bardwell – transported by EMS.

Aubrey Hale – transported by EMS.

Wade York – trapped in rubble for hours, but removed and transported by EMS.

Charmaine McKinzie – transported by EMS.

Vernelia Childs – transported by EMS.

Leory Childs – transported by EMS.

Around 0556 hours, I contacted the University of Missouri (MU) Hospital to determine life status of those transported – and learned that all the victims would survive, albeit serious injuries.

While on scene, I met with Missouri State Fire Marshall Brian Baker (#1479) who was assigned the case. Investigator Baker stated that he was assigned the case and would be working towards identifying the source of the explosion.

As JCFD continued to work through the structure fire and damage, JCFD requested my assistance in removing a truck that was parked in the driveway – disabling the ability for their emergency equipment to get close to the residence.

Toebben's Towing was contacted and requested to respond to the scene to tow the vehicle, for emergency personnel. Teobben's arrived on scene and towed a white Chevrolet pickup truck (no registration) from the scene.

The pickup truck was charred from fire, and I was unable to obtain a full vehicle identification number (VIN), but was able to identify the last portion as “xxxxx23255F927392.” I completed a tow report, and the vehicle was removed by Toebben’s.

JCFD personnel also provided with a red/pink iPhone cellular device, which they stated had maybe fallen from anyone of the victims - but they did not know the original source of where it came from. I learned the iPhone was found on the ground while attending to the victims, and it was picked up by JCFD personnel. The phone had 1% battery, and there was no identifiers on the screensaver to help in identifying any possible owner.

I secured the red/pink iPhone into evidence at the police department. The owner of the phone is unknown.

After obtaining information that all of the victims would survive and there was no need for death investigation, and Missouri State Fire Marshall’s initial suspicion that the explosion was gas related – the need for any further criminal investigation from our agency was suspended.

Fire Marshall Baker and I exchanged information for future collaboration.
