Sheriffs from across Missouri today announced the formation of the Missouri Sheriffs Constitutional Firearms Alliance (MSCFA), a statewide effort dedicated to safeguarding the constitutional right of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms.

The MSCFA unites county sheriffs under one banner to advocate for responsible gun ownership, oppose legislation deemed unconstitutional or harmful to public safety, and provide community-focused firearms-safety education.

"Our duty as sheriffs is first and foremost to the Constitution," said Sheriff DeGase, a founding member of the MSCFA. "Missourians deserve to know their sheriffs are standing firm in defense of their God-given rights, and this Alliance lets us do that—together."

Sheriffs will formally introduce the MSCFA at a press conference on Monday, July 14, at 2:15 p.m. in Hearing Room 2 at the Missouri State Capitol in Jefferson City. Media representatives are invited to attend and ask questions.

The Alliance will:

- Advocate for responsible gun ownership and strict accountability for violent criminals.
- Oppose and, when necessary, litigate against measures that infringe on Second Amendment rights.
- Promote public education through firearms-safety resources, training events, and open forums with lawmakers.

Missouri has long been a stronghold of individual liberty. By creating the MSCFA, the state's sheriffs are sending a clear message: the Constitution is not negotiable.
